# **KNOWSLEY BOROUGH COUNCIL**

The Council of the Borough of Knowsley, Chester Street and Williams Street, Prescot (Experimental Residents Parking Scheme) Order 1004

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Knowsley in exercise of its powers propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. When this Order comes into effect, save as provided in paragraphs 3 and 4 below, no person will be allowed to cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the following lengths of road for a period of 18 months.

- (a) Chester Street, both sides from a point 13.7 metres south of its junction with Kemble Street, for a distance of approximately 65 metres in a southerly direction; and
- (b) Williams Street, both sides from a point 13.7 metres south of its junction with Kemble Street, for a distance of approximately 65 metres in a southerly direction;
- as shown on drawing No. TES/TM/1231.

3. In relation to paragraph (2) above, exemptions will allow waiting:

- (i) to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
- (ii) by a disabled person's vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge;
- (iii) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from a vehicle;
- (iv) where the driver is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to avoid an accident;
- and in connection with:
- (v) statutory powers and duties;
- (vi) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (vii) collection and delivery of postal packets, and, where necessary;
- (viii) the maintenance of the roads and services therein;
- (ix) building operations; and
- (x) supplying gas, electricity and water.

4. Nothing in paragraph (2) of this notice shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any passenger vehicle, goods vehicle or motor cycle to wait at any time in the lengths of road referred to if there is displayed at all times of such waiting in a prominent position on that vehicle, a Permit issued by the Council and the exemption in respect of which that Permit was issued has not been revoked by the said Council.

5. Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which together with a map showing the prohibited areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the receptions at the Municipal Buildings, Kirkby, Municipal Buildings, Huyton, Council Offices, High Street, Prescot, Council Offices, Delph Lane, Whiston and Council Offices, Raven Court, Halewood.
