DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Outland Road (Old Tavistock Road) Plymouth) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that on 16th November 1994, the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is:

1. To prohibit the waiting of vehicles for more than 2 hours in any period of 4 hours between the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, on parts of the south side of Outland Road (Old Tavistock Road).
2. To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time and the loading and unloading of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9.15 a.m., Monday to Saturday on parts of the north side of Outland Road (Old Tavistock Road) (part of island), part of the south side of Outland Road (Old Tavistock Road), part of the west side of Access Road between Outland Road and Outland Road (Old Tavistock Road) (part of island), and part of the east side of Access Road between Outland Road and Outland Road (Tavistock Road).
3. To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on parts of the north and south sides of Outland Road (Old Tavistock Road).

Exceptions will be provided in the Order permitting waiting for the purposes of boarding and alighting, building and demolition, roadworks and the maintenance of essential services.

Exceptions will also be provided permitting waiting for the loading and unloading of goods and for vehicles used by disabled persons in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme other than the period of the proposed loading and unloading ban as specified in 2 above.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads to which the Order relates may be inspected during normal office hours at the address given below.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 17th November 1994, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Order will come into force on 18th November 1994.
