ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The A595 Trunk Road (Washington Street to Cross Hill, Workington) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Experimental) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 9(1) to (3) and 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on a length of the A596 Trunk Road, known as Washington Street, Guard Street and Cross Hill,

Workington, in the borough of Allerdale, in the county of Cumbria.

The purpose of the Order is to prohibit waiting at all times on either side of the length of trunk road between the south side of its junction with Ramsey Brow and Pow Street and a point 110 metres south-west of the centrepoint of its junction with Park End Road.

Exemptions have been provided in the Order to enable:

a person to board or alight from a vehicle;

goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;

(3) a vehicle to be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation;

(4) the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or its services;

(5) a vehicle to be used by a local authority or gas, water or sewage or electricity authority or of any telecommunications apparatus in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties;

(6) a vehicle to be used for the purposes of delivering or collecting

postal packets;
(7) a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to either side of that length of road;

(8) a vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
(9) a disabled person's vehicle to wait for up to 2 hours; or

(10) a vehicle to be used in connection with any function being carried out at St. John's Church fronting the western side of the Trunk Road.

The A19 Trunk Road (Easington) (Prohibition of Use of Gap in Central Reservation) Order 1994

The Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A19 Trunk Road in the District of Easington, in the county of Durham.

The effect of the Order which comes into force on 18th November 1994, is to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in either of the carriageways of the trunk road to enter or proceed through gaps in the central reservation:

opposite the field access approximately 130 metres south of the C22 Eden Vale junction;

2. opposite the junction of the A19 with Manor House Farm turn off approximately 360 metres south of the C22 Eden Vale junction;

3. 250 metres south of the junction of the A19 with the unclassified road 36.5;

4. at the junction of the A19 with Sheraton Hill Farm turn off 470 metres south of its junction with the unclassified road 36.5;

5. 800 metres south of the junction of the A19 with the unclassified road 36.5;

6. 100 metres south of the junction of the A19 with the C24 at Sheraton: or

7. 290 metres south of the junction of the A19 with the C24 at Sheraton.

Any person wishing to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in the Order, conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any Instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 18th November 1994, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Any person wishing to object to the proposals should send a written statement of the grounds of objection to the Director Northern Network Management and Construction, Programme Division of the Highways Agency at the above address, quoting reference no. DN 5049/41/5/02, not later than 8th December 1994.

If it appears to the Director, Northern Network Management and Construction Programme Division of the Highways Agency essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, he may after consulting with the Chief Constable for Cumbria and giving such public notice as the Secretary of State may direct, modify or suspend the operation of this Order or of any provision contained therein.

The A47 Trunk Road (Wisbech Road, Thorney, Cambridgeshire) (Variable Speed Limit) Order 1994

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 84(1)(c), (1A) and (2) of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any motor vehicle from being driven at a speed exceeding that indicated by variable traffic signs on the length of A47 Trunk Road known as Wisbech Road in Thorney between points 26 metres east of Woburn Drive and 78 metres east of Sandpit Road, a distance of 252 metres, which is at present a restricted road by virtue of street lighting. A 20 m.p.h. speed limit will be in operation on all school days during the following times:

(i) 0830 hours to 0905 hours;

(ii) 1155 hours to 1305 hours; and

(iii) 1510 hours to 1550 hours.
