INDIAN QUEENS POWER LIMITED

Notice of Application for consent to Construct a 160MW Peak Power Facility at Indian Queens, Cornwall

Notice is hereby given that Indian Queens Power Limited ("the Company") has applied under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 ("the Act") for the consent of the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry to construct and operate a combustion turbine peak power station at Indian Queens, Cornwall, and for a direction under section 90(2) of the Town and Country Planning Act that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted.

The new station to be known as the Indian Queens Peak Power Facility would have a capacity of approximately 160 Megawatts (MW).

A copy of the application, with a plan showing the land to which it relates, together with a copy of the Environmental Statement discussing the Company's proposals in more detail and presenting an analysis of the environmental implications, are available for inspection during normal office hours at the following addresses:
