VALE ROYAL BOROUGH COUNCIL

*Vale Royal Borough Council (Station Road, Winsford)
(Prohibition of Waiting and Revocation of Peak Hour) Order 1994*

Notice is hereby given that Vale Royal Borough Council in
pursuance of arrangements made under section 101 of the Local
Government Act 1972 with Cheshire County Council hereby
propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and
4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act").

The effect of this Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time in
the length of road specified in the First Schedule to this notice and
the Order specified in the Second Schedule will be revoked.

The Order will contain the usual exemptions including the right
for passengers to board or alight from a vehicle, for the loading and
unloading of goods, for the carrying out of building repairs and
other works, for the performance of statutory powers or duties and
to enable a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage
situated adjacent to the length of road affected by the proposed
restriction.

In addition, the Order will contain the usual parking concessions
for disabled persons in accordance with the orange badge scheme.

The purpose of the Order is to prevent congestion and ensure clear
visibility for drivers of vehicles entering and leaving the Trinity
Methodist Church.

Full details of these proposals are contained in the draft Order
which together with a map showing the length of road affected and a
statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order,
may be examined at the offices of Vale Royal Borough Council at
Wyvern House, The Drummer, Winsford, Cheshire during the
normal office hours.
