The Kent County Council (Traffic Restrictions) No. 4 Order 1994

Notice is hereby given that on 21st November 1994, the Kent County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which will be operative from 12th December 1994.

The notice of proposal to make the above-mentioned Order appeared in *The London Gazette* dated 21st October 1994, under reference number 14779/14780. The effects of the Order are as described in that notice, with the exception that the following restrictions have now been deleted.

- (a) No waiting at any time in Kingswood Road—east side between points 40 metres and 46 metres north of its junction with Bayhall Road.
- (b) Limited waiting to 2 hours in Kingswood Road—north side from a point 20 metres south-east of its junction with Pembury Road to a point 199 metres east of that junction.
- (c) No right hand turn from Calverley Park Gardens to its junction with Pembury Road, and from Kingswood Road to its junction with Pembury Road.
- (d) No waiting at any time in Mereworth Road—west side from its junction with Somerset Road to a point 21 metres north of that junction, and east side from its junction with Somerset Road to a point 66 metres north of that junction.
- (e) No waiting at any time in Somerset Road—both sides between points 26 metres west and 20 metres east of its junction with Mereworth Road.
