Notice is hereby given that the Scunthorpe Borough Council on 20th January 1995, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the Humberside County Council made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to 2(3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to introduce traffic regulations to prohibit waiting at any time on lengths of the roads set out in the Schedule hereto.
