Proposed Moorgreen Colliery Reclamation Scheme

Suspension of Public Right of Way Application 1995

Notice is hereby given that the Miller group Limited, in connection with the working of coal by opencast operations, propose to apply under section 15 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958, to the Secretary of State for an Order suspending a non-vehicular right of way as described in the Schedule below.

Opencast planning permission for the working of coal has been applied for.

Written objections, stating the grounds on which objections are made, may be sent to any person, to the Secretary of State before 13th March 1995, at the Department of the Environment, Room C16-21, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB. If the District Council or County Council in whose area any part of the right of way lies, objects and does not withdraw their objection, the Secretary of State must arrange a public inquiry if he thinks fit.

SCHEDULE PART 1

Right of Way to be suspended

Part of footpath No. 3 in the Parish of Greasley, which runs from Engine Lane east of Brunel Avenue to the north-eastern corner of field OS 0046, being that part that runs from a point immediately south of Engine Lane and 40 metres east of the rear of Brunel Avenue for approximately 240 metres east, and then approximately 100 metres south to a point approximately 250 metres south of Engine Lane.

SCHEDULE PART 2

Alternative Way

From a point immediately south of Engine Lane and 40 metres east of the rear of Brunel Avenue, in a generally southerly direction for approximately 130 metres. The path will then continue east for 200 metres to rejoin footpath No. 3.
