(Amendment No.) Order 199

The Waltham Forest (Blackhorse Lane) (Parking Places) Order 199

The Waltham Forest (Blackhorse Lane) (Free Parking Places) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, hereinaster called the Council, propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985, the Road Traffic (Parking) Act 1986, the Parking Act 1989 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

The general effect of the Orders would be to introduce a controlled parking zone north and east of Blackhorse Road Station by the provision of added waiting restrictions, shared residents/business/visitors parking places and some free parking places.

The zone would extend to include an area roughly bounded by Blenheim Road, E.17. in the north, Longfield Avenue and Suffolk Park Road in the south, Chatham Road and Ickworth Park Road in the east and Blackhorse Lane and Blackhorse Road in the west.

The further general effects of the Orders:

(1) would be to further amend the Waltham Forest (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977 so that waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the streets and lengths of street specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Details of exemptions for certain vehicles and persons are contained in the original Order of 1977.

- (2) in respect of the Waltham Forest (Blackhorse Lane) (Parking Places) Order 199 and the Waltham Forest (Blackhorse Lane) (Free Parking Places) Order 199 would be to provide:
 - (a) free parking places on all the streets adjacent to Forest Road and Blackhorse Lane where certain vehicles may wait for a maximum of 30 minutes and return to that parking place would be prohibited for one hour;
