THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The County Council of Clwyd (Improvement of Barker's Well Lane (Part) and Graig Road (Part), Denbigh) (Classified Roads) (Side Roads) Order 1994.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made by the County Council of Clwyd under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (b) to stop up highways;
- (c) to construct a new highway;
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises,

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified roads known as Barker's Well Lane (Ffynnon Barcer) and Graig Road (Ffordd y Graig) (part) between the new multi-storey car park in Barker's Well Lane and Coed Parc-Pierce, Graig Road which the Council is proposing to improve.

Copies of the Order, as confirmed, and of the relevant plan, may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at the offices of the County Council of Clwyd, Room 1328, Shire Hall, Mold, Clwyd; Denbigh Library, Hall Square, Denbigh, Clwyd, and at the Welsh Office, Legal Group, Cathays Park, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with may, within 6 weeks of 10th February 1995, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or any provision contained therein.

*Notice of proposed Public Rights of Way Extinguishment Order,
Dun Cow Street, Sunderland*

The Secretary of State for the Environment has prepared in draft an Order entitled the Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way (Dun Cow Street, Sunderland) Order 1995. The effect of this Order, if made, would be to extinguish all public rights of way over the major part of the public highway known as Dun Cow Street, Sunderland, comprising an area of 720 square metres or thereabouts. The area over which public rights of way would be extinguished is hatched black on the plan attached to the draft Order.

A copy of the draft Order and the map attached to it may be inspected by any person, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at the offices of Sunderland City Council, Civic Centre, Sunderland SR2 7DN, during a period of 28 days from 10th February 1995. Any person may, within that period object to the making of the Order by notice to the Secretary of State at the Government Office for the North-East, Planning Branch, Environment Division, Wellbar House, Gallowgate, Newcastle-upon-Tyne NE1 4TD, quoting ref.
