 - (c) If the vehicle is in the service of or employed by the Post Office and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to that road are being unloaded from the vehicle or, having been unloaded, therefrom, are being delivered, or while postal packets are being collected from premises for posting boxes adjacent to that road for loading on the vehicle;
 (d) While the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such
 - (d) While the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any road not being the restricted road, is being used in connection with any building or operation or demolition in or adjacent to the restricted road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in the restricted road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the restricted road or of any laying erection, alteration or repair in or repair in or adjacent to the restricted road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (e) To a vehicle waiting on the main carriageway specified in the Schedule below or any gate or main barrier to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise than on that carriageway while such gate or barrier is being opened or closed;
