PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Halling Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of Rochester-upon-Medway has, pursuant to section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, designed the area described below as the Halling Conservation Area.

The boundary of the Halling Conservation Area follows the rear of the properties on the western side of the High Street from number 66 in the north to 146 in the south. It then crosses the High Street, includes number 107 and follows the southern and eastern boundaries of a housing site to the rear of 107. It continues north enclosing the site of the Bishops Palace to the rear of St. John the Baptist Church. It crosses Ferry Road and follows the rear boundaries of 99 to 93 High Street. It continues north along the eastern side of a private access road at the rear of 91 to 51 High Street and turns in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of numbers 51 and 66 High Street.

The properties included are:

High Street 66 to 70, 72 (The Homeward Bound Public House), 82 to 116 including Bourne Cottage, Peg Tile Cottage and The Hall House, 122 to 124, The New Bell Inn, 130 to 146 including Church View, 107 (Faversham House), Eight houses under construction to rear of 107, 99, St. John the Baptist Church 95 to 97 (Lower Halling Post Office, Headlines hairdresser and two flats above), the Halling Institute, 51 to 91;

Ferry Road The remains and site of the Bishops Palace;

Cemetery Lane Three lock up garages.

The consequences of designation are as follows:

- (1) certain buildings may only be demolished with the consent of the Local Planning Authority;
- (2) It becomes an offence to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in the area except with the
- consent of the Local Planning Authority; (3) the Local Planning Authority has a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the area:
- (4) the Local Planning Authority has a duty to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area;
- (5) planning applications for development which would, in the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area must be given publicity and representations received in consequence taken into account in determining the application;
- (6) permitted development rights under the General Development Order 1988, are more restricted than in other areas;
- (7) specific statutory duties are imposed on telecommunications operators;
- (8) the right to display certain types of illuminated advertisement without express consent it excluded.

In addition, the conservation area policies in the Medway Towns Local Plan, 1992, will apply.

The Halling Conservation Area was designated on 12th January 1995. A plan showing the extent of the conservation area and copies of the Local Plan are available for inspection during normal office hours at the Civic Centre, Strood, Rochester, Kent ME2 4AW. (516)
