 - (2) The initial charge shall be payable on the leaving of the vehicle in the parking place by the insertion in the ticket machine relating to the parking bay in which the vehicle is left coins of the denomination of 5p, 10p, 20p or 50p to an amount equalling the initial charge required by paragraph (1) to this article.
