Parking Places Amendments—Yellow Line Review V Controlled Parking Zone E

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council propose to make the City of Westminster (Parking Places) (No.) Order 199 under sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order would be to:

- (a) provide additional residents' parking space in:
Bennett Street, Carlton House Terrace, Charles II Street, Park Place, St. Jame's Square and Waterloo Place;
- (b) provide additional 2 hour metered parking bays in:
Charles II Street, King Street, Pall Mall, Park Place and Regent Street.

The classes of vehicles for which the parking places would be available, the hours during which they would operate and all time limits during which vehicles may be left in those parking places would remain the same as for other similar parking places in the immediate vicinity.

A copy of the proposed Order, of the City of Westminster (Parking Places) (No. 3) Order 1975 (and of the Orders which have amended or applied that Order), of plans which indicate the locations and effects of the Order and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected until the expiration of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published in One Stop Services (first floor), Westminster City Hall, 64 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QP.

The City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No.) Order 199

The City of Westminster (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (Permit Parking Places) (No.) Order 199

The City of Westminster (Doctor Parking Places) (No.) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be further to amend the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that in the length of Elgin Avenue specified in the Schedule to this Notice:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited at any time;
- (b) waiting by vehicles for more than 20 minutes in the same place for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week.

The general effect of the Parking Places order would be to:

- (a) redesignate 2-hour metered and residents' parking places in Elgin Avenue and Scott Ellis Gardens the nett result of which provides 2 additional meter bays in Elgin Avenue;
- (b) in respect of the metered and residents' parking places, the classes of vehicles for which they would be available, the hours during which they would operate and all the times limits during which vehicles may be left in the parking place would remain unchanged.

The general effect of the Disabled Persons Parking Places Order would be to provide disabled persons parking places in Elgin Avenue and Scott Ellis Gardens, which would be available for the use of vehicles which display Westminster disabled permits issued in respect of those parking places without charge or time limit.

The general effect of the Doctor Parking Place Order would be to:

- (a) provide a doctor parking place in Elgin Avenue for the medical practice located at No. 42 Elgin Avenue;
- (b) revoke two doctor parking spaces in Elgin Avenue allocated to the Maida Vale Medical Centre;
- (c) provide that the parking place would operate between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any day of the week, that the charge for the permits for the use of the parking place would be £76 and the permit would be valid for 12 months.

Copies of the proposed Orders, of the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, the City of Westminster (Parking Places) Order 1973, the City of Westminster (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (Permit Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1993 and the City of Westminster (Doctor Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously amended or applied those Orders), of plans which indicate the locations and effects of the Orders and of the Council's statements of reasons for proposing to make the Orders can be inspected between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which the notice is published at Acer Consultants Ltd., Fifth Floor, Glen House, Stag Place, London SW1E 5AG.

The City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No.) Order 199

The City of Westminster (Parking Place) (No.) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be further to amend the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, so that in the lengths of streets specified in the Schedule to this Notice, the hours during which the existing prohibition applies on:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be changed so that it would apply at any time;
- (b) waiting by vehicles for more than 20 minutes in the same place for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be changed so that it would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week.

The general effect of the Parking Place Order would be to:

- (a) provide a residents' parking place in Taunton Mews;
- (b) provide that in the residents' parking place, vehicles displaying a valid parking card bearing the letter "B" issued by the City of Westminster in respect of that vehicle may be left. The charge for its use would be 70 pence per day, unless a valid season ticket is displayed. Season tickets cost £20 for 3 months or £71 for 12 months;
- (c) provide that the parking place would operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive (except on Christmas Day, Good Friday or Bank Holidays);
