- To prohibit any vehicle from waiting at any time in parts of the following roads:

  - Route 3/137 which connects A429 to B4068 and passes through Lower Slaughter to Upper Slaughter, Route 49637 which runs from Slaughter Farm to Upper Slaughter, Route 40638 which connects 40637 to 3/137 known as Kingswell Lane, Route 40583 which connects the B4068 at Lower Swell To 3/137 at Upper Slaughter, Route 40632 which connects B4068 to 40583, Route 40635 which connects 40583 to 3/137 at Lower Slaughter, Route 50580 which runs from Manor Farm to 3/137 at Upper Slaughter.
- Schedule 3 of Gloucestershire County Council (Lower Slaughter) (Various Roads) (Prohibiton of Waiting) Order 1984 and Schedule 3 of the Gloucestershire County Council (High Street, Stow-on-the-Wold) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1983 are hereby revoked.
- 5. The Order will contain the usual exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of boarding and alighting, loading and unloading, building operations on or under the roads and in connection with the services of statutory undertakers in relation to the prohibition of waiting. Exemptions will also apply to disabled persons' vehicles.
