Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 68 cubic metres per hour, 680 cubic metres per day and 9,864 cubic metres between 1st April and 30th September each year but limited to the following quantities at the following abstraction points: 6,800 cubic metres from 1. 6,140 cubic metres from 2. 6,690 cubic metres from 3. 6,500 cubic metres from 4. 6,000 cubic metres from 5. 2,386 cubic metres from 6. 4,091 cubic metres from 7. 4,080 cubic metres from 8. and 2,250 cubic metres from 9.

The water will be used for spray irrigation. The application is for renewal of a current licence which expires this year with extended range of some abstraction points, two additional abstraction points and additional areas on which the water may be used but no increases in aggregate quantities of water.

Notice of application for consent in pursuance of Schedule 10

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Schedule 10 of the Water Resources Act 1991, that an application has been made to the National Rivers Authority, Anglian Region by East Waste Limited for consent to discharge trade effluent. The application is for a consent to discharge up to a maximum of 80 cubic metres per day of treated leachate and site drainage from March Landfill site into an unnamed watercourse at National Grid Reference TL 4052 9883.

The discharge is to be made to prevent pollution of drainage ditches by untreated leachate. The treated leachate will be required to comply with conditions of consent imposed by the Authority.

March Landfill is within the Fenland District Council and Cambridgeshire County Council areas.

Notice of application for a licence to abstract water and vary an existing licence

Take notice that W. E. Wingrove & Sons, of Shredding Green Farm, Langley Park Road, Iver, Buckinghamshire SL0 9QS, are applying to the National Rivers Authority for a licence to abstract water from the underground chalk strata at National Grid Reference

TQ 024 810 and also vary an existing licence to abstract water from the gravel strata at National Grid Reference TQ 025 810 both in the parish of Iver, South Buckinghamshire District.

The proposal is to abstract water from the chalk at the following rates: 27.3 cubic metres per hour, 655 cubic metres per day, 41,000 cubic metres per year.

This application is to replace licence No. 28/39/28/482 which will be revoked.

The water from the chalk will be used to maintain levels in a reservoir in the gravel strata for subsequent spray irrigation. The proposed variation to the existing licence No. 28/39/27/69 is to increase the annual abstraction from the reservoir in the gravel strata from 36,400 cubic metres to 45,500 cubic metres in order to accommodate the extra extraction applied for from the chalk.

COAST PROTECTION ACT

HOLDERNESS BOROUGH COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

ARFON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Arfon Borough Council (Off-street Parking Places) Order 1995
