

EASTLEIGH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Eastleigh (Telegraph Road, West End) (One-way Traffic) (Experimental) Order 1995

Notice is hereby given that the Eastleigh Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council has made an Order in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit the driving of vehicles in the road specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this notice other than in the direction specified in Column 2.

The Order shall be operative from 13th August 1995, and will be on an experimental basis only for a period of up to 6 months. A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the road to which the Order relates and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at my office at the Civic Offices, Leigh Road, Eastleigh, during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order, or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 2nd August 1995, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Council will consider whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued indefinitely by a permanent Order.

Written objections to the making of a permanent Order, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be received by the undersigned within 6 months of the coming into force of (i) the experimental Order, or (ii) any relevant variation or modification to the experimental Order.

Urban Clearway Order Monday to Saturday 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., Gower Road

Between its junction with the eastern kerb-line of Pen-yr-Heol Drive and a point approximately 180 metres west of its junction with Hendrefoilan Student Village Access Road. A distance of approximately 650 metres.

Parkway

Between its junction with Gower Road and a point approximately 5 metres south of that junction.

To prevent vehicles executing a right turn from Parkway to Gower Road.
