- (d) in connection with the delivery and collection of plant and/or materials used for construction or maintenance of buildings abutting the highway;
- (e) in accordance with a special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of Ipswich Borough Council.
- 2. Where the vehicle is:
 - (a) a goods vehicle being used for the conveyance of goods to or from premises abutting the highway between the hours of 4.30 p.m. and 10.30 a.m. and which leaves that road not later than 11 a.m. on the same day, or
 - (b) an armoured security vehicle engaged in security duties on the highway.

When the vehicle is an invalid carriage as defined in Section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
