- (c) any vehicle travelling in the eastbound carriageway from making a right turn through the gap opposite Redhill Field Lane into the Bilbrough Top development;
- (d) any vehicle on entering the A64 from the Bilbrough Top development to proceed in any direction other than westwards; or
- (e) any vehicle on entering the A64 from Redhill Field Lane to proceed in any direction other than eastwards.

The M27 South Coast Motorway (Ower-Chilworth Section) Connecting Roads Scheme 1970 Variation Scheme (No. 2) 199

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make a Scheme under sections 16, 17, 19 and 326 of the Highways Act 1980 providing that the M27 South Coast Motorway (Ower-Chilworth Section) Connecting Roads Scheme 1970 (as varied by a Scheme made in 1994) be further varied.

The Scheme to be varied authorises the provision of a length of road connecting the M27 Motorway with other highways near Ower and Nursling in the County of Hampshire.

The variation Scheme will provide that the part of the westbound slip road east of Junction 2 of the M27 Motorway, 80 metres in length, which connects with the roundabout junction (part of the A36 Trunk Road) shall cease to be a special road.
