Rushmoor Borough Council (North Lane and Adjoining Roads, Aldershot) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Amendment) Order 1995.

North Lane:

West side, from a point 15 metres south of its junction with Redan Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 7 metres

From a point 44 metres south of its junction with Redan Road in

a southerly direction for a distance of 21 metres.

From a point 83 metres south of its junction with Redan Road in a southerly direction to a point 61 metres north of its junction with Canning Road.

From a point 15 metres north of its junction with Canning Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 5 metres.

East side, from a point 76 metres south of its junction with Deadbrook Lane in a southerly direction to a point 14 metres north of its junction with Denmark Street.

Redan Road, both sides, from a point 15 metres west of its junction with North Lane in a westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres.
