Notice is hereby given that Fareham Borough Council propose to make the above-named Order, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to provide an authorised street parking place on the north side of Gordon Road from a point opposite the east side of Derlyn Road in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 35 metres to a point 10 metres west of its junction with Colenso Road. Notice is hereby given that Fareham Borough Council propose to make the above-named Order, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

1. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting Monday to Friday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. inclusive in the following lengths of road:

##### *Borough of Fareham (Various Roads, Portchester) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 13) Order 1995*

Notice is hereby given that Fareham Borough Council propose to make the above-named Order, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Hampshire County Council, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting in the following lengths of roads:

(a) *Hatherley Drive*, on both sides, from its junction with Hatherley Crescent in an easterly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

(d) *Cornaway Lane*, on the west side, from a point approximately 17 metres north of its junction with Hatherley Drive in a southerly direction to a point approximately 18 metres south of its junction with Hatherley Drive.

(e) *Allenby Grove*, on both sides, from a point opposite the western boundary of No. 2 Allenby Grove in an easterly direction for a distance of 49 metres to its junction with King George Road.

(f) *King George Road*, on both sides, from its junction with Allenby Grove in a northerly then easterly direction for a distance of 43 metres to a point opposite the eastern boundary of No. 49 King George Road.

(g) *Wellington Grove*, on both sides, from its junction with Allenby Grove in a southerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

#### MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

##### *Mid Glamorgan County Council (High Street, Edwards Terrace and Park Street, Trelewis) (Revocation) and (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1995.*

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to:

(1) Revoke the following Orders:

(i) "The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Park Terrace, (Route B.4254) Edwards Terrace and High Street, Trelewis) (Revocation) and (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1983"

(ii) "The Urban District Council of Gelligaer (Roads at Trelewis) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1974"

(2) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the lengths of roads and sides of lengths of road, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled person's vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 3 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.
