The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Route) (No.) Traffic Order 199 (Banned Left Turn from Blackhorse Lane into Forest Road E.17).

The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (No.) Traffic Order 199 (Banned 'U' Turns at the Blackhorse Lane/Blackhorse Road/Forest Road E.17 Junction).

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest proposes to make the above-mentioned Orders under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.
