# (d) Charges and classes of vehicle to be:

Resident' parking permit, £10 per year or part of year. (Please note that the Council has agreed to the withdrawal of the £10 Residents' charge and this is currently being arranged). Visitor's parking permit, £2 per block of ten (i.e. visitor's permit will cost 20p per day).

Business Users' permit, £20 per year or part of year.
