Hague, March 3. The Treaty for renewing the Alliances between Great-Britain and this Republick, concluded at Westminster the 17 of last Month, having been transmitted hither, is according to the usual Forms fent to the respective Provinces for their Confent to its being ratified by the States General. On the 29th past, the Turkish Aga who has been here fome time folliciting Satisfaction for a Ship taken about 5 Years ago by a Zealand-Privateer, having defired to make a Visit to the British Minister Mr. Horatio Walpole, was prevented by that Minister: The Aga received and entertained him fuitably to his Character. Yesterday the Counts Schaesberg and Efferen, Ministers of the Elector Palatine, had a Conference with the Deputies of the States General for foreign Affairs, and communicated to them His Electoral Highnefs's Anfwer to the Terms on

which their High Mightinesses had propoled to confent to his Imperial Majesty's Cession of Limburg to him.
