HARBOURS ACT 1964

WHITEHAVEN HARBOUR REVISION ORDER 1995

Notice is hereby given that the Whitehaven Harbour Commissioners 'the Commissioners") and the Whitehaven Development Company Limited ("the Company") have applied to the Secretary of State for Transport to make a Harbour Revision Order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The objects of the proposed Order are:
(1) To authorise the Commissioners to construct and maintain with all necessary works and conveniences connected therewith the following works at Whitehaven Harbour namely:

Work No. 1-A lock structure, enclosing a basin of width 13-7 metres and length 30 metres, having an overall length of 53 metres, an overall width of 35 metres, bounded on both sides by retaining walls and enclosed at both ends by gates having a width of 13.7 metres, extending from the Old North Wall to Work No. 2 and incorporating a two-storey control room.

Work No. 2—An extension of the Old Quay commencing in

a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 14 metres terminating at Work No. 1 and having an overall width of 10

Work No. 3—The construction of openwork fendering, commencing at the south-south-west retaining wall of Work No. 1 and extending in a west-north-westerly direction for a distance of 50 metres and there terminating.

Work No. 4—The construction of toe protection to the North Wall in rock and geotextile fabric, commencing at a point at NX 297204518603, 180 metres north-east from the commencement of Work No. 1 and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 111 metres to a point at NX 297096518625 and there terminating.

Work No. 5-The construction of toe protection to the Old North Wall in rock and geotextile fabric, commencing at Work No. I at a point at NX 297083518513, 32 metres east-north-east from the commencement of Work No. I and extending for a distance of 117 metres to a point at NX 297076518613 and there

terminating.

Work No. 6—Piled moorings together with a pontoon system to be constructed or placed in the Inner Harbour commencing with a bridge connection at a point at NX 297222518262 and extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 175 metres to a point at NX 297088518373 and there terminating.

Work No. 7—Piled moorings together with a pontoon system to be constructed or placed in the Custom House Dock commencing with a bridge connection at a point at NX 297148518212 and extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 90 metres to a point at NX 297096518285 and there

terminating.

Work No. 8—Piled moorings together with a pontoon system to be constructed or placed in the South Harbour commencing with a bridge connection at a point at NX 297060518160 and extending in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 110 metres to a point at NX 297022518263 and there terminating.

Work No. 9-Piled moorings together with a pontoon system to be constructed or placed in Queens Dock commencing with a bridge connection at a point at NX 297269518386 and extending in a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 50 metres to a point at NX 297391518425 and

there terminating.

Work No. 10—The construction of toe protection to the Old Quay in rock and geotextile fabric commending at a point at NX 297074518448, 63 metres south-south-east from the commencement of Work No. 1 and extending for a distance of 49 metres to a point at NX 297076518613 and there terminating.

(2) To empower the Commissioners to alter, enlarge, replace, relay, extend or reconstruct the proposed works and to construct and maintain subsidiary and accommodation works.

(3 To enable the Comissioners to undertake works for the strengthening of the sea walls of Old Quay, North Wall and Old North Wall.

- (4) To enable the Commissioners to improve, maintain and manage the harbour and the facilities afforded therein; to provide for the operation of the lock forming Work No. I to prevent or alleviate flooding or to meet any other emeregency; to provide for restrictions to pleasure craft and certain other vessels of the Inner Harbour, Custom House Dock and South Harbour and the exclusion of certain commercial vessels from the harbour; to provide for the appropriation of parts of the habour, the provision of vessels and equipment and life-saving appliances, the holding of exhibitions, regattas and other entertainments in the harbour, the provision of parking places, the making of byelaws for the good rule and government of the harbour, the giving of general and special directions to vessels, the power to deal with unserviceable vessels, the removal of obstructions other than vessels, the removal of vehicles obstructing or interfering with the harbour, the boarding of vessels, general rules for navigation and dealing with vessels adrift.
- (5) To make provision as to the payment of charges for services and facilities provided at the harbour, and the leasing of the harbour or any part of it; to disapply section 33 of the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847; to make provision for such other matters as may be incidental to or consequential upon any of the foregoing purposes.

A copy of the draft Order and the plan and sections which accompany the application may be seen at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Company at The Market Hall, The Market Place, Whitehaven CA28 7JG, and at the offices of the under-mentioned

Solicitors and Parliamentary Agents.

The Secretary of State has determined that the application for the Order should be made subject to an environmental assessment and the Company has accordingly supplied the Secretary of State with information under paragraph 1A of Schedule 3 to the Harbours Act 1964. A copy of this information may be seen at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Company at The Market Hall, The Market Place, Whitehaven CA28 7JG, and at the offices of the under-mentioned Solicitors and Parliamentary Agents.

Notice of application to vary a licence to abstract water
