North Yorkshire County Council (One-way Traffic) (Pauls Row and Greengate, Malton) Order 1995

CONGLETON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Sandbach Conservation Areas Nos. 18b and 18c 1995

The Sandbach Conservation Areas Nos. 18b and 18c 1995 to incorporate the Bold Street, Green Street, Welles Street area and Wesley Avenue with Chapel Street areas as extensions to the Conservation Area.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 70 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 ("the Act") that the Congleton Borough Council has determined that the areas described in the Schedule to this notice which contains a number of Listed Buildings are areas of special architectural or historic interest and has accordingly designated the said areas as Conservation Areas.

The effect of the designation of the Conservation Areas includes the following:

(1) The demolition of certain buildings is subject to sections 74 and 75 of the Act, section 74(1) of which states that a building in a conservation area shall not be demolished without the consent of the appropriate authority.
