WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

Notice is hereby given that on 7th August 1995 the Secretary of State for the Environment acting under section 29 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, made the Leven Canal (Humberside) Nature Conservation Order 1995 applying section 29(3) of the Act to the lands described in Schedule 1 to the Order and specifying the operations set out in Schedule 2 the Order which appear to the Secretary of State likely to destroy or damage the water habitat and associated flora, by reason of which the site is of special interest and of national importance. The Order is reproduced in the annex to this notice.

The general effect of the Order is to prohibit any person from carrying out the operations specified in Schedule 2 to the Order on the land described in Schedule 1. In certain circumstances this prohibition does not apply. These circumstances are set out in section 29 of the Act.

The Order took effect when it was made and will cease to have effect 9 months after it was made unless the Secretary of State previously gives notice that he has considered it and does not propose to amend or revoke it or that he has amended or revoked it.

Representations about or objections to the Order may be made to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Room 903A, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol BS2 9DJ, before 18th September 1995. They should be in writing and should state the title of the Order. In the case of objections, the grounds on which they are made should be stated.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to in it have been deposited at the offices of the Beverley Borough Council, The Hall,

Lairgate, Beverley, East Yorkshire HU17 8HL. They may be seen, free of charge, at all reasonable hours.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

LEVEN CANAL (HUMBERSIDE)

Nature Conservation Order 1995

Whereas the land which is described is in the opinion of the Secretary of State for the Environment of special interest and of national importance by reason of it being a canal fed by calcareous springs and containing water of high quality together with associated aquatic, riparian and wetland flora.

And whereas it appears to the Secretary of State expedient to apply section 29(3) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to the said land for the purpose of conserving the water habitat with its associated flora.

And whereas the Secretary of State has consulted the Nature Conservancy Council for England.

Now therefore the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 29(1) and (3) of the said Act of 1981 hereby orders as follows:

1. Section 29(3) of the said Act of 1981 shall apply to the land described in Schedule 1 hereto and shown edged black on the map contained herein.
2. The operations specified in Schedule 2 hereto appear to the Secretary of State to be likely to destroy the water habitat with its associated flora.
