NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Newcastle-under-Lyme (Chapel Street, Bignall End) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1995

Notice is hereby given that on 18th August 1995, the Borough Council of Newcastle-under-Lyme, acting as agent for Staffordshire County Council, made the above Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into operation on 4th September 1995.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles during the hours from 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday (inclusive) on that length of the south side of Chapel Street, Bignall End commencing at the boundary between the grounds of the Central Methodist Church and No. 85 Chapel Street and continuing for a distance of 25 metres in an easterly direction.

The Northamptonshire County Council (Doddington Road, Earls Barton) (Restricted Road) Order 1995

(Resident Permit Parking Only—6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive in Oundle)

East Road, east side:

From a point 33 yards north-east of its junction with South Road for a distance of 7 yards in a north-easterly direction.

From a point 38 yards south of the centre line of Taney Court for a distance of 33 yards in a northerly direction.

From a point 5 yards north of the centre line of Taney Court for a distance of 17 yards in a northerly direction.

St. Osyth's Lane, east side, from a point 14 yards south of its junction with Market Place to its junction with East Road.
