

LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK

The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No.) Traffic Order 1995

Notice is hereby given in accordance with The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1989, that the Council of the London Borough of Southwark, proposes to make the above-mentioned Order.

The proposed Orders would be made under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Schedule 5 Part 1 Paragraph 4(3)(a) of the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order would be to amend the Southwark (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Traffic Order 1976 so as to:

- (a) prohibit the waiting or loading of vehicles at any time in Massinger Street as follows:
 - (i) the west side, between its junction with the Old Kent Road and its junction with Congreve Street;
 - (ii) the south-east side, from its junction with the Old Kent Road for a distance of 45 metres;
- (b) prohibit the waiting and loading of vehicles at any time in Congreve Street as follows:
 - (i) the north-east side, from the north-western kerb-line of the junction with Massinger Street for a distance of 20 metres in a westerly direction.

A copy of the proposed Order, of a plan, of the previously mentioned Order and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published in the Municipal Offices, Larcom Street SE17 1RY.

MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL

Proposed Waiting Restrictions on High Street and Turner Street, Manchester

Notice is hereby given that the Manchester City Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is:

Parking Places and Controlled Parking Zone (Manchester) Order 1971 (Variations) Number 130 Order 1995.

To prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday and between 8 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Saturday on:

High Street, north-west side, between the eastern kerb-line of Nicholas Croft and a point 3 metres north-east of the south-western kerb-line of Turner Street.

Thomas Street, north-east side, between 5 metres north-west of High Street, to 5 metres south-east of Salmon Street.

These proposals will be incorporated into the proposed restrictions advertised on 23rd May 1995, and which related to the Northern Quarter area.

Exemptions are included in the proposed waiting restrictions for purposes of boarding or alighting, loading/unloading, funerals, building operations or works on or under the lengths of road. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying a disabled persons' badge and a parking disc will be allowed to wait for up to 3 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the proposed Order together with a plan showing the roads to which it relates together with a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at my office Room 601, Town Hall, Manchester, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

Objections to the proposals, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be sent to me in writing, quoting ref. L/ED, no later than 18th September 1995.

MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL

City of Manchester (Wendover Road and Ferndown Road, Brooklands) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1995

Notice is hereby given that on 21st August 1995, Manchester City Council made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting at any time on:

Wendover Road, south-east side from 15 metres south-west of Ferndown Road for 75 metres north.

Ferndown Road, both sides from Wendover Road for 15 metres.

Exemptions are included in the waiting restrictions for purposes of boarding or alighting, loading/unloading, funerals, building operations or works on or under the lengths of road. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge and a parking disc will be allowed to wait for up to 3 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 4th September 1995, and a plan showing the roads to which it relates may be inspected at my office, Room 601, Town Hall, Manchester, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 21st August 1995, apply to the High Court for such purpose.
