The Lewisham (Prescribed Routes) (No.) Traffic Order 1995

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Lewisham, in accordance with the provisions of section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by section 8 of and Part I of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985, intend to make the above-mentioned Traffic Order.

Proposed No Waiting At Any Time on Wythenshawe Road/Downham Walk, Brooklands

Notice is hereby given that the Manchester City Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is:
