**ST. James's, March 12.** The following Address has been presented to His Majesty.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Common-Council of the City of Durham, and their Representatives in Parliament. Presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; in the Absence of the Lord Bishop of Durham.

*Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.*

**Ratisbon, March 12.** Letters of the 9th of last Month from Seralio, the chief Town in Bosnia, bring Advice, that the main Army of the Turks is certainly to take the Field in March; and that the Grand Vizier with 90000 Foot and a Number of Horse, will march and encamp before Zadar or Zara, a considerable Sea-Port in Dalmatia belonging to the Venetians, where he is to be joyned by the Fleet: He is also to have a Train of Two hundred Pieces of Artillery, and Sixty Mortars, most of the smaller Sizes; and besides the Officers and Gunners already arrived at Seralio, Two hundred and fifty were expected there the next Week. The Grand Signior designs to reside, till this Siege shall be over, at Cupres in Bosnia, where Timber is preparing to build him a Seraglio; having changed his Resolution of going to Belgrade, to avoid giving Umbrage to the Emperour. Several Vessels of all Sorts are getting ready at Widdin; all the Roads in Bosnia are mended, and the Bridges over the Drin, Bosna, and Verbos, are repaired. The chief Magazines on the Save are to be at Gradiska and Dolbachitz. The Bassaw of Bosnia is ordered to give in an Account of all the Provisions in his Province, and of all the Horse and Foot he can bring into the Field. Two flying Camps will be formed on the Frontiers of Croatia. The Advices from Vienna, as to a Rupture with the Turks, are still various; tho' repeated Orders have been issued to all the Imperial Regiments in Hungary, to keep themselves in a Readiness to march. Letters of the 15th of last Month from Rome, say Count Gallas had received the Emperour's Leave to make a Tour to Vienna; and was preparing for setting out on his Journey in 8 or 10 Days.

**Hambourg, March 17.** The Duke of Mecklenbourg is set out from Swerin to go to meet the Czar. M. Schleinitz on the Part of the Czar, and M. Petkum on the Part of the Duke of Mecklenbourg, are adjusting the Marriage Settlements between that Duke and the Dutchess Dowager of Courland. The heavy Cannon from Stralsund being arrived in the Camp before Wilmar, will be placed on Redoubts, which are making for that purpose: The first Work when the Siege of that

Place in form is begun, will be to cut off the Communication between the Fort of Walsish and the Town. 'Tis advised, that there is great Want of Provisions in the said Town so that the Inhabitants begin already to suffer very much. The Czar had set out from Dantzick for Stargard, but turned back upon receiving Advice on the Road, that the King of Poland was coming thither to confer with him. His Czarish Majesty has however sent Orders to Count Goloffskin his Minister at Berlin, to repair forthwith to Stargard and wait his Arrival there. Letters from Berlin tell us, that the King of Prussia, the Imperial Minister Count Virmond and other Persons of Distinction, will shortly set out for Stargard. The last Letters from Copenhagen say the King of Denmark would set out on the 14th Instant for Holstein: And that the Squadron of Men of War sitting out at Copenhagen, will in a few Days be ready.

**Edinburgh, March 6.** Letters from Elfick give an Account, that Lieutenant-General Cadogan was arrived there, on his way hither: That Orders had been sent to Major-General Wightman, for the immediate disarming of the Marquis of Huntley's and Earl of Seaforth's Men, and all the Rebels Clans who are within Reach of the Garrison of Inverness, and for apprehending their Chieftains. Directions were also sent to Major General Sabine who Commands at Perth, to disarm Bradalbin's and Drummond's Men; and such of the Duke of Athol's who have been in Rebellion, and to secure the Gentlemen and Heritors. A Detachment having been order'd from Aberdeen into the Braes of Mar, the common People who had been in Rebellion brought in their Arms, and submitted to Mercy. A considerable Detachment will forthwith be sent to Fort-William, in order to the disarming of the Western Clans, the Principal of which are those of Lochills, Glengary, Clan Renald, and Mackdonald. Which done, the Peace and Tranquility of Scotland will be perfectly secured. We have a Report, that the Marquis of Huntley and Lord Rollo have surrender'd themselves at Inverness, and that the Earl of Bradalbin has surrender'd himself to Collonel Campbell of Fanab.

**W**hereas by an Act of Parliament made in the Eleventh and Ninth Years of the Reign of his late Majesty King William, it is enacted, That after the 24th of March 1697, no Silver Vessels, Plate, or Manufactures whatsoever, shall be wrought or made, less than 11 Ounces 10 Penny-Weights of fine Silver in every Pound Troy. Nor sold or Exchange'd, if made after that Time, (unless it be Silver Wire, or if it all Troy be capable of receiving a Mark) in the same hath been marked with the two first Letters of the Surname of the Workman, and with the Marks of the Company of Goldsmiths, London, (being a Lion's Head crested, the figure of a woman, commonly call'd Britannia, and a Mark denoting the Year) under the Regulation of the said Act. And whereas several Workmen, notwithstanding the said Act, do frequently work up and vend such Plates and Manufactures of Silver, being one third Part worse than the said Act directeth, to the great Detriment of His Majesty's Subjects, and Detriment of the said Trade; (the new Sterling Silver looking much better than said Silver, and wearing better than Silver of a worse Alloy.)
