HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 AND ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

Notice is hereby given that Public Local Inquiries in connection with the Orders mentioned below will be held by an Independent Inspector appointed for the purpose by the Secretary of State for Transport, beginning at 10 a.m., on Tuesday, 10th October 1995, at Dawdon Miners Social Welfare Scheme Social Club Limited, Mount Stewart, Dawdon, Seaham, County Durham to hear representations from statutory objectors (as defined in the Compulsory Purchase by Non-Ministerial Acquiring Authorities) (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1990, and the Highways (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1994 and from any other persons having an interest in the land the subject of the Orders, and at his discretion, to hear representations from any other persons who may desire to appear and be heard.

The Orders are Orders which have been made by the Durham County Council under the above-mentioned Acts and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation and are:

1. The County Council of Durham (A182 South of Seaham Industrial Corridor Dawdon to A19) (Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1995. This is an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 which if confirmed would authorise the Council to:

- (a) improve highways
- (b) stop up highways
- (c) construct new highways
- (d) stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) provide new means of access to premises

all in relation to the "classified road" which the Council propose to construct from a point on Hill Crescent 95 metres south-east of Dawdon Hill Farm, commencing with a roundabout junction, in a southerly then westerly direction for 3.4 kilometres to a point 186 metres west of the Pemberton Arms Public House, Cold Hesledon to include a grade separated junction with the A19 Trunk Road.

2. The County Council of Durham (A182 South of Seaham Industrial Corridor Dawdon to A19) Compulsory Purchase Order 1995. This is an Order under sections 239, 240 and 250 of the Highways Act 1980 and the Acquisition of Land Act 1981 which, if confirmed, would authorise the Council to acquire land and rights across land to construct the classified road and carry out works as

detailed in the Side Roads Order mentioned above. The Order would also authorise the acquisition of land for use by the Council in connection with the aforementioned works and for the mitigation of any adverse effects that the construction and improvement of highways may have upon the surroundings thereof.

Copies of the above-mentioned Orders and of the plans referred to therein have been deposited and may be seen at all reasonable hours, free of charge, at the offices of the County Secretary and Solicitors, County Hall, Durham; Seaham Branch Library, St. Johns Square, Seaham; Easington District Council, Seaside Lane, Easington and at the offices of the Secretary of State for Transport.

Proceedings on the above-mentioned Orders are being taken concurrently by virtue of section 257 of the Highways Act 1980.
