Sr. James's, March 19. THE following Affociations having been transmitted by the Lords Justices of Ireland, have been prefented to His Majefty by the Right Ho rable James Stanhope, Elq; One of His Majefty's principal Secretaries of State.

An Affociation of the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Clogher, and Clergy of his Diocefs.

 W^{E} the Bifhop and the reft of the Clergy of the Dioceis of Clogher, out of a deep Sense of Duty to Our most Gracious Soveraign King George, do unanimoufly profess and declare Our just Abhorrence and urmost Detestation of the present unnatural R velli on in Great Britain, fomented and railed by Papifts, and other difloyal and traiterous Sub-jects, in manifest Violation of the most faceed Engagements, and to the utter Ruine of all Our religious and civil Liberties. And as We do from Our Hearts recognize and affert King George's undoubted Right and Title to the Crown of His Royal Ancestors, and to the fole Supremacy over Us, fo We do hereby engage to use all Means agreeable to Our ho-ly Function to support the same; and by Preaching and Example to animate Our People with zealous Resolutions, in so just a Cause, to defend His Majesty's facred Person and Government against the flagrant Attempts of him who prefumes to ftile himfelf King by the Name of James the Third of England, and of Scotland the Eighth: And also against all those who, not having the Fear of God before their Eyes, shall adhere to him, or his Interest, whom We look upon as infatuated in their Counfels, exposing all that is valuable to subject us to a Superstition, from which Our first pious Reformers facrificed even their Lives to deliver Us. And We do farther, by this Our Affociation, fincerely vow and engage to Almighty God, to King George, and to one another, to do every Thing, that in Us lies, to prevent and discover any wicked Defigns that are or may be form'd againft His Majefty's facred Perfon, their Royal Highneffes the Prince or Princefes of Wales, or any of their Royal Islue; those bleffed Pledges of the Divine Favour to Us, for the Security of Our happy Constitution both in Church and State.

An Affociation of the Governour, Deputy-Governours, High Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, Clergy, Gentlemen, Freeholders, and others of the County of Meath.

An Affociation of the Gentlemen, Freeholders, Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown and Mannor of Castle Stewart in the County of Tyrone.

An Affociation of the County of Mayo.

An Affociation of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgeffes, Minifters, and other principal Inhabitants of the Town and Liberties of Coleraine in the North of Ireland.

An Affociation of the High Sheriff, Governour, Deputy Governour, Juflices of the Peace, Gentlem v, Freeholders, and other the Protestant Inhabitants of the County of Kil-

keiny. Which Affociations His Majesty was pleased to vreceive very graciously.

Ratisbon, March 16. On the 12th Inftant Count Sternberg with several other Officers of the Emperour's Court arrived here, in order to meet and compliment the Princels of Gruoti 'r to the Empreis, and defray benhagen her Journe o Vienna. Her Highness defigns to be on the 19th at Donawert, where Boats attend for her by the Elector of Bavaria's Orders, at Neubourg on the 20th, at Kel-heim on the 21ft, and at Donastauff on the 22d, where she will go on board the Emperour's Boats, without landing at this Place. On the 13th Count Trautmandorff came hith r in his Return from his Ambaffy in Switzerland, and continued his Journey to Vienna the next Day. Letters of the 29th paft from Peterwaradin fay they had repeated Advices. from Conftantipople, that the T -ba eve making very great Preparations for next came paign by Sea and Land, fince they did not doubt but it must come to a Rupture with the Emperour, having perfect Informations of the Measures taking on his Side: But the Gene-rality of the People were on this Account in no small Confernation, and otherwise difcontented at the prefent Government : Endeavours were used to quiet them, by spreading Reports on the Frontiers that the Peace with the Emperour was prolonged, and nothing to be feared from those Quarters. at Dantzick - Part of his Troops and the Artillery are ordered to approach that Town ; where his Czarifh Majefty will continue till the Arrival of the King of Poland, who, 'tis advifed from Warfaw, defigned to fet out from thence on the 8th Instant, accompanied by the Counte Flemming and Lagnasco, M. de Manteuffel, the Bishop of Cujavia, and the Crown-General. The King of Denmark has deferred fixing the Day of his Departure from Copenhagen for Holftein, till the Return of a Courier whom his Majesty has sent to the Czar. Some Advices fay, that the Czar defigns to go to Copenhagen, to fee the Fleet there.

Hague, March 24. Baron Heems the Imperial Minister is returned from Amsterdam, where he has been about a Fortnight, lifting Officers and Seamen for the Service of the Emperour's Fleet on the Danube: The Report of that Minister's being gone to Munfter, to influence the Election of a Coadjutor of that Bishoprick, appears to have been groundless.

groundlefs. The States of Holland refumed their Session here to Day. Several of the Provinces have fent hither their Ratification of the Treaty for renewing the Alliances be-tween Great Britain and this State 3 and that of Holland will likewife be difpatched before the States of that Province feparate. The Corfairs of Algiers and those of Salle having, without any previous Declaration of War, attacked and taken feveral Ships belonging to the Subjects of this State, notwithstanding they were provided with due Passports according to Agreement; their High Mightin'fles, upon Complaint made to them of those Piracies, have under Confideration the iffuing out Commissions to Privateers to act against thole Corfairs.

Edinburgh, March 15. Lieutenant-General Gadogan having dilpatched repeated Orders to Major-General Wightman to fend out Parties from Inverness to pursue and difarm fuch of the Rebels of the Western Clans as may be lurking about that Part of the Country, and having reinforced the Garri-fon of Fort-William with five Hundred Men, will next Week march himfelf into the Highlands with a Detachment which he has ordered to draw together at Dunkield. He will go by the Blare of Athol to Reven in Badenoch, and from thence into Glengary's and Clan-Renald's Country.
