HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Gloucestershire County Council (Lydney By-pass, Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1995

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made by Gloucestershire County Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, and which as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to carry out the improvement of highways;
- (b) to stop up highways;

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 17th November 1995, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order, or of any provision contained therein.
