THE following Addresses and Associations having been transmitted by the Lords Justices of Ireland, have been presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable James Stanhope, Esq; One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty. The humble Address of the Governors, High-Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, Grand-Jury, Gentlemen and Freeholders of the County of Tipperary, at an Assizes held at Clonmell, in and for the said County, the 17th of March, 1715.

May it please Your Majesty,

THE happy and seasonable Accession of Your most sacred Majesty to the Throne, and the great and wonderful Successes that have since attended Your Arms and Negotiations, give us the firmest Assurance that we shall long enjoy the Religion and Liberties restored by the late King William, of ever glorious Memory, and now again secured to us by Your Majesty's most gracious Declarations and Promises. We of this County in particular find our selves delivered from a Yoke that was too grievous: And we beg Leave to make use of this first Opportunity we have had of meeting, under Judges of Your Majesty's appointing, to declare to Your Majesty, that as we were always open and zealous Assertors of the Right of the Protestant Succession in Your most illustrious House, when we laboured under the greatest Discouragements on that Account, so we shall be always vigilant to prevent the Mischiefs designed by those wicked and pernicious Men, who profess unlimited Passive-Obedience; but have shewn, that they are too ready to sow and foment Sedition, and practice Rebellion.

The following Address having been presented to His Majesty, was received very graciously.

An humble Address of the High-Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, Grand-Jury, Clergy, and Freeholders of the County of Sussex, at the Assizes holden at East-Grinstead on the 19th of March, 1715. Presented to His Majesty by Charles Goodwin, Esq; High-Sheriff, accompanied by several Gentlemen of the said County; introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Hartford, Lord-Lieutenant, and Custos Rotulorum of that County.

Vienna, April 15. On the the 13th Instant about 7 in the Evening the Empress was brought to Bed of an Archduke, the News of which was received by this Court and City with all imaginable Demonstrations of Joy: Last Night between 8 and 9 a-Clock, the Solemnity of Christning him, was performed in the great Hall of the Imperial Palace, where necessary Preparations had been made, to which Hall the March from the Empress's Bed Chamber was in the following Order; viz. the Nobility and Persons of Distinction of the Court in great Numbers, the Knights of the Golden Fleece in their Habits of Ceremony, Sig. Grimani Ambassador of Venice, the Cardinal of Saxe-Zeitz, the Emperour in the Ceremonial Habit of the Order of the Golden Fleece, the Empresses Dowagers, and the 4 Archdutchesses. Then came the Prince of Lichtenstein, Steward of the Emperour's Household, carrying the Royal Infant, Archduke of Austria, and Prince of Asturias, assisted by two Gentlemen, and followed by the Ladies of the three Empresses Households, and by several others. He was held at the Font by Prince Maximilian of Hanover, officiating as Godfather on the Part of the King of Portugal, the two Empresses Dowagers being Godmothers; and he was named Leopold, John, Joseph, Anthony, Francisco di Paula, Ermengild, Rudolphus, Ignatius, Balthasar: The Service being performed by Sig. Spinola the Pope's Nuncio, attended by 24 Archbishops, Bishops, and other Dignitaries. The Office of Baptism being ended, Prince Eugene of Savoy, Knight of the Golden Fleece, carried the young Archduke to the Emperour, who being seated, conferred on him in a proper Form, the Knighthood of the Golden Fleece, putting over his Neck the Collar of that Order; and then the new Knight being placed on a Velvet-Cushion embroidered with Gold, which was laid on a Table next to the Emperour's Chair, was complimented by every Knight of that Order in his Rank. This done, the Pope's Nuncio began the *Te Deum* which was Sung to Musick; and then the Company returned in the same Order as they came to the Empress's Bed-Chamber.
