## From Mincione April 24. to 定aturbay April 28. 1716.

THE following Addreffes have been prefented to His Majefy.
An humble Addrefs of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Juftices of the Peace, Clergy, Gen tlemen, and Freeholders of the County of Lincoln, met at the Aflizes held at the Caftle of Lincoln, the 12 th 1) 2y of March, 1715-16. Prefented to His Majefty by Sir Cecil Wray, Baropet, High Sheriff of the fad County, introduced by his Grace the Duke of Ancafter, Losd Great Chamberlain of England.
An bumble Addrefs of the Provincial Synod of Aberden. Prefented to His Majefty by Mr. James Anderfon, Minifter, and by Mr. James Rabertfon, One of the Members of that Synod; intruduced by the Right Ho. nourable the Lord Viscount Townhend, One of His Majefty's principll $S$ cretaries of Srate.
Whis isddefl's His Majetry was pleafed to reantise very gruciouly.
Ratisbon, April 23. The Emperor's De. mand of an Aid for the approaching War with the Turks, which had been communi. cared on the 1 tht, was then propofed in the Dyet, and the nifpatch of it recommended by the Aullian Miniter that the Refolutions to be rak( ${ }^{3}$ ) might be of Ufe ard Effe $\mathcal{G}$ for the prefent Campaign. Siveral of the RomanCuho!ck Minifers had already received In. flructions to fecond this Requeft, as to the Suscours in general; and the Palatine Minifter declared in paricular, that he had Orders to propofe the furnulhing a compleat Budy of 30000 Men, with all Neceffries; but finding the Imperial Coutt would zather bave this Affitance in Money, or at leaft in Infantry alone, he woald wait for furcher Direstions. On the 20th in the Morning Prince Lowenftein received a Courier, with the Emperor's Ordurs to notify to the Dyet in Form, as he immediately did, That the Emprefs was brevght to Bed of a Son on the 13 th in the Evening, who had the Title given him of Archduke of Auftria and Prince of Afturias. Up $n$ which the Dyet refolved to congratulate His Imperial Majefty, and to return him Thanks for the Natification, by a general Conclufion. On the 26th Prince Lowenftein will give a pub. 'lick Entertainment on this Occafion.
Corenhagrn, April 25 . The, 20th Inflant we had Letters from Norwsy, which broughe Advices from that Country as far as the 13th, of which the moft materral are, That at the coming away of the laft Letters, Vice-Admiral Gabel was arrived with his Squadron in the Road of Flagge near Frederick ftadt, and that be intended to land his Troops in thofe Parts; the Swedifh Army lay divided in three Bodies, the great and chicf Corps being till at Chriftiania, and the two other fmall ones, (of about 6 or 800 Men each) lying the one between Mofs
and Frederickfadt, and the other between Swinfund and Frederick-Hall: It was prefumed that thefe two little Bodies would be in danger of a Defeat, unlef, they quitted their Poits; bur, as we are ithll inform'd, the Swedes feem to be providing for a Retreat, and particularly, they are making a Paflage over the Swinfund, and have lately fent General Afchemberg with a Detachment of 600 Horfe towards $S$ weden, as it is believed, to fecure fome Paffes, which are of Importance to favour their return home. We expect more circumftantial Accounts of Affairs in thofe Countries by our next Letters; in the mean time our Court appears very eafy at prefert, as to the Iffue of them. We had News here the e3d, by a Veffel from Pomerania, That four Swedifh Men of War, and three Frigats, were feen near yftedt, and thar feveral more were foon to follow them from Carlfcrona: This has increas'd our Application in fitting out the Ships defigned for the Squadron in thefe Seas; two Men of War, which failed lately to get Intelligence, upon this Advice retired into the Bay of Kiog; four Ships of the Line will go to join them there, the 26th or 27 th , in order to watch the Morinns of the Swedes, whom fome apprehend to have a Defign on our Flotilla, or on our Trinfports, though we perfwade ourfelves, that they cannot fit out any confiderable Force from Curlfrona, fo toon as it is given out. We expect every Mument the Poft which is due from Norway.
Dantzick, April 22. The Czar and the King of Poland continue bere. The King is lodged in the City, and is attended by his Guards; the Czar has his Quarters in the Suburbs, where a Number of his own Troops mount the Guard: He bas in the Territory belonging to this Place 24000 Men, befid-s the 7000 which are marched towards Wifmar. Thefe two Princes have had feveral Interviews, and their Miniftere are often in Conference. On the 15 th Inflant Sir Richard Vernon, Envoy Extraordinary of his Britannick Majefty, arrived here in 8 Days from Dreflen. On the rith the Marriage between the Duke of Mecklenbourg and the Czar's Niece, Sifter to the Princefs of Courland, was folemnized. The King of Poland, and his Minifters, ase allo all the foreign Minifters here, were invited to it, and were entertained with all Magnificence at the Czar's Quarters.

Hamboury, April 28. The King of Denmark having been at Rendeshourg, is now gone to Hufum ; but where the Interview between his Majefty and the Czar is to be, is yet uncertain. We have Advices from Petersbourg, That the Mufcovites have made themfelves Mafters of Cujanenbourg, after a Long Blockade and a Bombardment. 'Tis the only Place that the Swedes remain'd poffeffed of in the Dutchy of Finland.
