H E following Addreffes have been pre-fented to His Majefty. An humble Addrefs of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Justices of the Peace, Clergy, Gen tlemen, and Freeholders of the County of Lincoln, met at the Affizes held at the Caffle of Lincoln, the 12th Day of March, 1715-16. Pre-fented to His Majefty by Sir Cecil Wray, Ba-ropet, High Sheriff of the faid County, introduced by his Grace the Duke of Ancaster, Lord Great Chamberlain of England.

An humble Address of the Provincial Synod of Aberdeen. Presented to His Majesty by Mr. James Anderfon, Minister, and by Mr. James Robertson, Qne of the Members of that Synod; introduced by the Right Ho-nourable the Lord Viscount Townshend, One of His Majesty's principal S cretaries of State. reacher very gracioully.

Ratisbon, April 23. The Emperor's De-mand of an Aid for the approaching War with the Turks, which had been communicated on the 19th, was then proposed in the Dyet, and the Dispatch of it recommended by the Auffrian Minister that the Refolutions to be taken might be of Use and Effect for the present Campaign. Several of the Roman-Catholick Minifters had already received Instructions to fecond this Request, as to the Succours in general; and the Palatine Minifter declared in particular, that he had Orders to propole the furnishing a compleat Body of 30000 Men, with all Neceffiries; but finding the Imperial Court would rather have this Affistance in Money, or at least in Infantry alone, he would wait for further Directions. On the 20th in the Morning Prince Lowen-On the 20th in the Morning Frisce Lowen-flein received a Courier, with the Emperor's Orders to notify to the Dyet in Form, as he immediately did, That the Empress was brought to Bed of a Son on the 13th in the Evening, who had the Title given him of Archduke of Austria and Prince of Asturias. Up n which the Dyet refolved to congratulate His Imperial Majefty, and to return him Thanks for the Notification, by a general Conclusion. On the 26th Prince Lowenstein will give a publick Entertainment on this Occafion.

Corenhagrn, April 25. The, 20th Instant we had Letters from Norway, which brought Advices from that Country as far as the 13th, of which the most material are, That at the com-ing away of the last Letters, Vice Admiral Gabel was arrived with his Squadron in the Road of Flagge near Frederickstadt, and that he intended to land his Troops in those Parts ; the Swedish Army lay divided in three Bodies, the great and chief Corps being still at Christiania, and the two other small ones, (of about 6 or 800 Men each) lying the one between Mole

and Frederickstadt, and the other between Swinfund and Frederick-Hall : It was prefumed that these two little Bodies would be in danger of a Defeat, unless they quitted their Polts; but, as we are shill inform'd, the Swedes feem to be providing for a Retreat, and particularly, they are making a Paffage over the Swinfund, and have lately fent General Afchemberg with a Detachment of 600 Horfe towards Sweden, as it is believed, to fecure fome Paffes, which are of Importance to favour their return home. We expect more circumstantial Accounts of Affairs in those Countries by our next Letters; in the mean time our Court appears very ealy at prefent, as to the lifue of them. We had News here the e3d, by a Veffel from Pomerania, That four Swedish Men of War, and three Frigats, were seen near Yftedt, and that feveral more were foon to follow them from Carlscrona: This has increas'd our Application in fitting out the Ships defigned for the Squadron in these Seas; two Men of War, which failed lately to get Intelligence, upon this Advice retired into the Bay of Kiog; four Ships of the Line will go to join them. there, the 26th or 27th, in order to watch the Motions of the Swedes, whom fome apprehend to have a Defign on our Flotilla, or on our Trinsports, though we perswede ourselves, that they cannot fit out any confiderable Force from Curlscrona, so soon as it is given out. We expect every Moment the Post which is due from Norway.

Dantzick, April 22. The Czar and the King of Poland continue here. The King is lodged in the City, and is attended by his Guards; the Czar has his Quarters in the Suburbs, where a Number of his own Troops mount the Guard : He has in the Territory belonging to this Place 24000 Men, befid s the 7000 which are marched towards Wilmar. These two Princes have had feveral Interviews, and their Ministers are often in Conference. On the 15th Inflant Sir Richard Vernon, Envoy Extraordinary of his Britannick Majesty, arrived here in 8 Days from Drefden. On the 19th the Marriage between the Duke of Mecklenbourg and the Czar's Niece, Sifter to the Princels of Courland, was folemnized. The King of Poland, and his Ministers, as allo all the foreign Ministers here, were invited to it, and were entertained with all Magnificence at the Czar's Quarters.

Hambourg, April 28. The King of Denmark having been at Rendesbourg, is now gone to Husum ; but where the Interview between his Majefty and the Czar is to be, is yet uncertain. We have Advices from Petersbourg, That the Mulcovites have made themlelves Mafters of Cujanenbourg, after a long Blockade and a Bombardment. 'Tis the only Place that the Swedes remain'd possessed of in the Dutchy of Finland.
