PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREA) ACT 1990

Noak Bridge Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that Basildon District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") has authorised the designation of Noak Bridge, Basildon, as a Conservation Area, with effect from January 1996.

The Conservation Area includes the entire Noak Bridge estate; comprising all dwellings in Aylesbury Mews, Bridgecote Lane, Bridge Street, Coppice Lane, Crouch Street, Durban Lane, Fore Street, Gate Lodge Square, Gate Lodge Way, Kenilworth Place, Kimberley Drive, Littlehurst Lane, Lower Street, New Waverley Road, Saling Green, Tudor Court, and those properties fronting Wash Road between Bridge Street and Kimberley Drive. Together with Noak Bridge Primary School, Noak Bridge Village Hall, Doctors Surgery and 147, 149 Coppice Lane.

The designation of this area as a Conservation Area requires the Council and the Secretary of State for the Environment to pay special attention to the character and appearance of this area when exercising their powers of planning control. With very few exceptions, buildings within a Conservation Area may not be demolished except with the consent of the Local Planning Authority. Again, with very few limited exceptions, trees may not be topped, lopped, felled, up-rooted or wilfully damaged or destroyed unless 6 weeks notice of the proposed action has been given to the Local Planning Authority.

A plan showing the extent of the Conservation Area can be seen at the Planning Services Reception Desk in The Basildon Centre, Pagel Mead, Basildon, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

Objections to, and representations in respect of the proposals should be sent in writing to The Chief Planning and Highways Officer, Derbyshire County Council, County Hall, Matlock, Derbyshire DE4 3AG, before 12th April 1996.

Objections and representations should specify the matters to which they relate and the grounds on which they were made, and may be accompanied by a request to be notified, at a specified address, of the withdrawal, adoption, approval or rejection of the proposals.

Only objectors whose objections are made in writing and sent to the address specified above within a 6 week period will have a right to have their objections considered at a local inquiry. Consideration of objections received outside this 6 week period is a matter for the local planning authority's discretion, and Derbyshire County Council has resolved to consider objections received within a 9 week period ending on 12th April 1996, and not to consider any received after that date.

Notice of intention to adopt proposals

If no objections are received during the period given for making objections, Derbyshire County Council intend to adopt the proposals on the expiry of that period. (578)
