Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Parking Places Order would be to:

- (a) relocate and revoke certain 4 hour metered parking places on the south-east side of Craven Hill Gardens (northernmost south-west to north-east arm);
- (b) revoke a residents' parking place on the south-east side of Craven Hill Gardens (northernmost south-west to north-east arm) to provide a vehicular cross-over;
- (c) in respect of the metered parking places, the classes of vehicles for which they would be available, the hours during which they would operate, and all the time limits during which vehicles may be left in the parking places would remain unchanged.

The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be further to amend the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that in the lengths of Craven Hill Gardens specified in the Schedule to this notice, the hours during which the existing prohibition applies on:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be changed so that it would apply at any time;
- (b) waiting by vehicles for more than 20 minutes in the same place for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be changed so that it would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week.
