The A5 Trunk Road (Llangollen Road, Froncysyllte, Denbighshire) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1, 2, 4 and 124 of and paragraph 27 of Schedule to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection, it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.
