- Monkswood Avenue, southern kerb-line from the western boundary of No. 52 Monkswood Avenue in an easterly direction for approximately 210 metres as far as the junction of Monkswood Avenue with The Gladeway.
- Halfhides, both kerb-lines over entire length of the road as far the junction with Monkswood Avenue.
