POWYS COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Powys (Gipsy Castle Lane, Hay-on-Wye)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1996*

Notice is hereby given that on 13th June 1996, Powys County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order, which will come into operation on Monday, 24th June 1996, makes it unlawful to leave a vehicle at any time along the side of that length of the County Classified Road Number C76 known as Gipsy Castle Lane, Hay-on-Wye, which is specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions in the Order permit waiting for as long as it is reasonably necessary for the following purposes:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) building and demolition operations and
- (d) carrying out essential works connected with the maintenance of the road and the provision of water, gas, electricity and telecommunications services.

The Order also contains an exception permitting disabled persons' vehicles to park for periods not exceeding three hours with return within one hour prohibited.

The existing parking restrictions in Gipsy Castle Lane have been incorporated in the Order.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be examined during office hours at Powys County Hall, Llandrindod Wells, and The Post Office, Hay-on-Wye.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 24th June 1996 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE

County Classified Road No. C76: Gipsy Castle Lane, Hay-on-Wye

The north side thereof which extends from a point approximately 10 metres (11 yards) west of its junction with St. Mary's Road (i.e. at a point adjacent to the western boundary of Sackville cottages) for a distance of approximately 40 metres (44 yards) in a westerly direction to a point near the eastern boundary of No. 48 Gipsy Castle Lane. POWYS COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Powys (Lion Street, Hay-on-Wye) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that on 13th June 1996, Powys County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order is to amend parking restrictions in the County Classified Road No. C218 known as Lion Street, Hay-on-Wye.

This Order, which will come into operation on Monday, 24th June 1996, makes it unlawful to leave a vehicle:

- (i) at any time on any day along the side of the length of Lion Street, Hay-on-Wye, specified in Schedule I to this notice and

- (ii) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive along the side of the length of Lion Street specified in Schedule II to this notice.

Exceptions in the Order permit waiting for as long as it is reasonably necessary for the following purposes:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) building and demolition operations and
- (d) carrying out essential works connected with the maintenance of the road and the provision of water, gas, electricity and telecommunications services.

The Order also contains exceptions permitting disabled persons' vehicles to wait:

- (i) for periods not exceeding three hours with return within one hour prohibited along the side of the length of road specified in Schedule I to this notice and
- (ii) for periods not exceeding three hours with return within one hour prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and for unlimited periods at any other time along the side of the length of road specified in Schedule II to this notice.

The parking restrictions which formerly applied to the affected side of Lion Street have been revoked.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be examined during office hours at Powys County Hall, Llandrindod Wells, and The Post Office, Hay-on-Wye.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 24th June 1996 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE I

The east side thereof which extends from a point approximately 7 metres (8 yards) south of its junction with Heol-y-Dwr in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 10 metres (11 yards).

SCHEDULE II

The east side thereof which extends from a point approximately 17 metres (19 yards) south of its junction with Heol-y-Dwr for a distance of approximately 10 metres (11 yards) in a southerly direction to a point near the northern boundary of the premises known as "Hay Binders". (791)

SALFORD CITY COUNCIL

The City of Salford (Agecroft Road, Swinton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Salford propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

When the Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length of road specified in the Schedule below.
