Interpretation

2. (1) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 3 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the following definitions shall be inserted after "small packet":
"Swiftair packet" means an outgoing postal packet bearing a special label to indicate the desire of the sender that the packet should receive accelerated treatment within the United Kingdom and the destination country".

"Swiftpack" means a prepaid outgoing postal packet consisting of specially designated plastic envelope provided by the Post Office, use of which indicates the desire of the sender that the packet should receive accelerated treatment within the United Kingdom and the destination country".

"Swiftair plus Registered" means an outgoing postal packet bearing a special label provided by the Post Office to indicate the desire of the sender that the packet should receive accelerated treatment within the United Kingdom and the destination country and that the packet should be transmissible as an Insured packet under the terms of the Universal Postal Union Convention for the time being in force and the Detailed Regulations made thereunder".

"Swiftair plus Recorded" means an outgoing postal packet bearing a special label provided by the Post Office to indicate the desire of the sender that the packet should receive accelerated treatment within the United Kingdom and the destination country and that the packet should be transmissible as a Registered packet under the terms of the Universal Postal Union for the time being in force and the Detailed Regulations made thereunder".

Air mail packets

3. In sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 9 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount of "19p" shall be deleted and "20p" inserted in its place.

Printed packets

4.—(1) Sub-paragraph (4) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme as subsequently amended shall be deleted and the following shall be substituted:

"(4) A printed packet may be sent unenclosed without wrapper or envelope if it satisfies the roles and conforms to the limits of size applicable to postcards".

(2) Sub-paragraphs (5) and (6) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme as subsequently amended and sub-paragraph (8) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme as substituted by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 12) Scheme 1991 shall be deleted.

Accelerated treatment and express delivery

5. For paragraph 29 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, there shall be substituted the following:

"Accelerated treatment—Swiftair packets, Swiftair plus Registered packets, Swiftair plus Recorded packets and Swiftpacks"

29.—(1) Upon every Swiftair packet, there shall be charged and paid the fee of £2.70, in addition to postage and any other fees charged and payable thereon.

(2) Upon every Swiftair plus Registered packet, there shall be charged and paid the fees specified in Part 1 of Schedule 5A, in addition to postage and any other fees charged and payable thereon.

(3) Upon every Swiftair plus Recorded packet, there shall be charged and paid the fees specified in Part 2 of Schedule 5A, in addition to postage and any other fees charged and payable thereon.

(4) Upon every Swiftpack, there shall be charged and paid the fees specified in Part 3 of Schedule 5A.

(5) Swiftair packets, Swiftair plus registered packets, Swiftair plus Recorded packets and Swiftpacks shall be posted by being handed to an officer of the Post Office and shall be segregated from all other postal packets".

Compensation for registered packets

6.—(1) In sub-paragraph (2)(a) of paragraph 33 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount "£500" shall be deleted and "£1500" inserted in its place.

(2) In sub-paragraph (2)(b) of paragraph 33 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount "£25" shall be deleted and "£28" inserted in its place.

Insured letters
