ST. James's, July 9. The following Address was presented to His Majesty.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Capital Burgeſſes, Aſſiſtants, Gentlemen, Merchants, and other Inhabitants of the Borough of Tiverton in the County of Devon. Presented to His Majesty by Thomas Beare, Eſq; one of their Representatives in Parliament, introduced by the Right Honourable John Lord Carteret, Lord Lieutenant of the ſaid County.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Venice, June 26. Men are kept hard at Work in our Arsenal, to fit out two Men of War and ſome Galeaſſes, with all Expedition: Orders are alſo given for building 5 new Ships againſt the next Campaign. The Triumphant Lyon, with ſome other Ships of War, are newly ſailed with divers Transports; and other Men of War are getting ready to convoy ſome more Transports with 2500 Men. A French Ship which is arrived from the Levant, brings Advice, that the Squadron of Malta having met 3 Turkiſh Men of War belonging to Tunis, attacked them, and took and brought one of them (carrying 54 Guns) into Malta; the other two eſcaped: We have alſo an Account by the ſame French Ship, as well as by the way of Otranto, That the Malteſe have taken 12 Saicks bound for Conſtantinople with Rice.

Vienna, June 27. Prince Eugene of Savoy will ſet out from hence on the 30th Inſtant at fartheſt, for the Army in Hungary. The Emperor and Empreſs will go the ſame Day from hence to Marien-zell, and come back hither the next Week. His Imperial Majesty has declared Prince Eugene Governor of the Auſtrian Netherlands, and the Marquis de Prié Plenipotentiary for adminiſtring the Government of the ſaid Netherlands during that

Prince's Abſence. The Government of Milan, which Prince Eugene has reſigned, is given to the Prince of Lewestein Wertheim. The Dutcheſs of Wolfembuttel-Blankenberg, Mother of the Empreſs-Conſort, ſet out from hence this Morning to return home. Her Highneſs has had magnificent Preſents from the Emperor and the Empreſs. The Letters from the Frontiers confirm, that M Fleſchman, the Imperial Preſident at the Port, is put under Confinement; but the Turks give out, that 'tis done only to ſecure him from the Inſults of the Populace.

Hambourg, July 7. My Lord Polwarth's Baggage arrived here this Morning, and he is expected here to Morrow or next Day. Letters from Copenhagen of the 4th Inſtant give an Account, that on the 2d Captain Tordenshild ſailed from thence for Norway, with the Frigate called the White Eagle, and two large Prahmes, with other Veſſels. In the Categat he took a Swediſh Privateer of 8 Guns, and a large armed Boat; retaking at the ſame Time, a Ship from Jutland laden with Wood, with which he returned on the 4th into the Road of Elſinore, being hindered by contrary Winds from proceeding on his Voyage. The King had nominated Lieutenant General Lutzau, who commands in Norway, Knight of the Order of Dannebrog. On the 2d a Poſt from Norway arrived at Copenhagen, but brought no News, except that the Swedes were in want of Forage and Proviſions, eſpecially of Salt. The King of Denmark arrived from Fredricksbourg at Copenhagen on the 2d, and the next Day went in a Boat to view the Fleet. Baron Lowendal, the King of Poland's Great-Marſhal, is arrived here. We have Advice from Berlin, that the King of Prussia returned thither on the 3d Inſtant, and after ſome Days deſigns to go to Charlottenbourg. The Czar is gone to Roſtock, and after he has given the neceſſary
