ST. James's, July 9. The following Address was presented to His Majesty.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Capital Burgestes, Assistants, Gentlemen, Merchants, and other Inhabitants of the Borough of Tiverto in the County of Devon. Presented to His Majesty by Thomas Beare, Esq; one of their Representatives in Parliament, introduced by the Right Honourable John Lord Carteret, Lord Lieutenant of the faid County.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Venice, June 26. Men are kept hard at Work in our Arlenal, to fit out two Men of War and some Galeasses, with all Expedition: Orders are also given for building 5 new Ships against the next Campaign. The Triumphant Lyon, with some other Ships of War, are newly failed with divers Transports; and other Men of War are getting ready to convoy some more Transports with 2500 Men. A French Ship which is arrived from the Levant, brings Advice, that the Squadron of Malta having met 3 Turkish Men of War belonging to Tunis, attacked them, and took and brought one of them (carrying 54 Guns) into Malta; the other two escaped: We have also an Account by the same French Ship, as well as by the way of Otranto, That the Maltese have taken 12 Saicks bound for Constantinople with Rice.

Vienna, June 27. Prince Eugene of Savoy will set out from hence on the 30th Instant at farthest, for the Army in Hungary. The Emperor and Empress will go the same Day from hence to Marien-zell, and come back hither the next Week. His Imperial Majesty has declared Prince Eugene Governor of the Austrian Netherlands, and the Marquis de Prié Plenipotentiary for administring the Government of the said Netherlands during that

Prince's Absence. The Government of Milan, which Prince Eugene has refigned, is given to the Prince of Lewestein Wertheim. The Dutchels of Wolfembuttel-Blankenberg, Mo-ther of the Empress-Confort, I't out from hence this Morning to return home. Her Highnels has had magnificent Presents from the Emperor and the Empr stee. The Letters from the Frontiers confirm, that M Fle s.h. man, the Imperial President at the Port, is put under Confinement; but the Turks give out, that 'tis done only to secure him from the Insults of the Populace.

Hambourg, July 7. My Lord Polwarth's Bag-gage arrived here the Morning, and he is expected here to Morrow or next Day. Letters from Copenhagen of the 4th Instant give an Account, that on the 2d Captain Torden-shild failed from thence for Norway, with the Frigate called the White Eagle, and two large Prahmes, with other Vessels. In the Categat he took a Swedish Privateer of 8 Guns, and a large armed Boat; retaking at the same Time, a Ship from Jutland laden with Wood, with which he returned on the 4th into the Road of Elsinore, being hindered by contrary Winds from proceeding on his Voyage. The King had nominated Lieutenant General Lutzau, who commands in Norway, Knight of the Order of Dannebrog. On the 2d a Post from Norway arrived at Copenhagen, but brought no News, except that the Swedes were in want of Forage and Provisions, especially of Salt. The King of Denmark arrived from Fredricksbourg at Copenhagen on the 2d, and the next Day went in a Boat to view the Fleet. Baron Lowendal, the King of Poland's Great-Marshal, is arrived here. We have Advice from Berlin, is arrived here. that the King of Prussia returned thither on the 3d Instant, and after some Days designs to go to Charlottenbourg.
