The chief Particulars of the Action at Fre-thricks-Hall on the 5th Instant, are as fol-lows. About 2 in the Morning the Swedes advancing by Skoningfossen, made a sudden Attack on the Gate called the Kirckeporten and on the Borgerschanz. They were opposed by the Corps de Garde and by the Piquet of the Garrison, who maintained their Ground with great Bravery till 4 a-Clock, when the great Superiority of the Enemy (who were 3000 in Number) obliged them to retire to the Citadel. The Swedes taking Possession of the Town, Lieutenant Collonel Brun, who commanded in the Citadel, plyed them inrestantly with Cannon-Balls and Bombs, which fet the Town on Fire: The Swedes endeavoured to extinguish it; but the Flames spreading through the greatest part of the Town, forced them to leave the Houses, and get into the open Streets, and then to pass the Bridge over the River, the Anullery from the Citadel doing great Execution among them. The Loss of the Swedes, killed, wounded, and taken Priloners, amounts to about 700. The Lols of the Danes was inconfiderable. The Advantage gained by M. Tordenschild was in the following Manner: He anchored the 7th of July near Stromsted, on the 8th about Noon he artacked the Flotilla of Swedish Gallies which lay at Anchor in Dynekilden. Two of their largest Gallies opposed him at his Entrance, but in a little Time he sunk them, and cannonaded the rest till towards Evening, when they all surrendred, to the Number of 13 Gallies and 8 Transports.
