Notice of application for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of an inland water by means of impounding works

Take notice that South West Water Services Limited, of Peninsula House, Rydon Lane, Exeter EX2 7HR is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of the River Exe at National Grid Reference SS93422494 at Exbridge Industrial Estate, Exbridge.

Water will be impounded by a 21 metre wide, 1:80 truncated flat v-weir of maximum height approximately 0.28 metre above existing river bed level and the object of the impounding works is to fulfil the requirements of an existing abstraction licence numbered 14/45/02/2388, dated 31st March 1993, which relates to abstraction for the pumped augmentation of Wimbleball Reservoir. The weir will provide a measurement and monitoring structure to ensure compliance with the flow constraints of the existing abstraction licence and measurement thereof.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

Devon County Council (Baker Street Area, Exeter) (Residents' Parking Places, Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order

Notice is hereby given that Devon County Council propose to make the above Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Order 1984, the effect of which will be to introduce residents' parking (no parking without a residents' parking place permit) in specified lengths of the following roads: Baker Street, Barrack Road, Church Terrace, Haldon View Terrace; prohibit waiting at any time in a specified length of Church Terrace; limit waiting to 2 hours (no return within 4 hours) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday inclusive, in specified lengths of the following roads: Baker Street, Barrack Road, Church Terrace; provide parking places for disabled persons' vehicles in specified lengths of the following roads: Baker Street, Church Terrace; revoke specified lengths of no waiting at any time in Baker Street.

Existing waiting restrictions in the area will be incorporated into this one Order.

The Order contains the usual exemptions relating to the picking up and setting down of passengers, loading and unloading of goods, the maintenance of the road and telecommunications apparatus, and the supply of gas, water and electricity. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles will apply to those lengths of road subject to normal waiting restrictions.

In addition, vehicles may wait on the specified residents' parking places if being used in connection with medical or nursing purposes at adjacent premises, in connection with funerals, for servicing of domestic appliances, cleaning windows or chimneys, posting or removing advertising material, the transportation of equipment being used by a hairdresser or chiropodist at adjacent premises, provided in each case the address where the driver can be located is displayed on the windscreen of the vehicle.

Full details are contained in the Order, which together with plans showing the affected lengths of roads and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined during usual office hours at the offices of the Local Service Officer, Exeter, County Environment Department, Devon County Council, Lucombe House, County Hall, Exeter; or at Reception, Phase 1, Exeter City Council, Civic Centre, Exeter.

Objections to the proposals, specifying the grounds on which they are made, must be submitted in writing to the address below, to arrive not later than 4th October 1996.
