*The A5 Trunk Road (Llangollen Road, Froncysyllte, Denbighshire)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1996*

Notice is hereby given that on 9th September 1996, the Secretary of State made the above Order which will come into operation on 23rd September 1996.

The effect is as stated in notice 481 in *The London Gazette* No. 54407 dated 24th May 1996.

Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with, may, within 6 weeks of 20th September 1996, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Stopping-up of Highways (Land at the Junction of Western Avenue and Cowbridge Road East, Cardiff) Order 199

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping-up of the length of highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to allow development consisting of Landscaping to be carried

out in accordance with planning permission granted to Cardiff City Council on 13th February 1996, under reference 95/01867/W.

During the 28 days from 20th September 1996 copies of the draft Order and the annexed plan may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Cardiff County Planning Department, Wood Street, Cardiff and may be obtained, free of charge, from the address below quoting the Welsh Office reference.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may, by notice to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Cathays Park, Cardiff CF1 3NQ (quoting reference ZC 510-5-71-2), object to the making of the Order. In the preparation of an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

SCHEDULE

(all measurements are approximate)

The highway to be stopped up is in Cardiff and is shown by Zebra hatching on the annexed plan. It is that length of access road, which has a maximum width of 4 metres, running adjacent to part of Western Avenue and Cowbridge Road East in front of the former properties 435-459 Western Avenue (now demolished), which extends from its junction with Cowbridge Road East in a northerly direction for 113 metres to its junction with Western Avenue. WATER INDUSTRY ACT 1991

Consumers in some areas supplied by Three Valleys Water PLC who might be affected by improvement work being carried out by the Company will wish to be aware of the following information.

The Company has found through its water quality monitoring programme that water received by consumers in these areas fails on occasion to meet the standards, for certain parameters (normally those associated with occasional occurrences of discoloured water), as required by the Water Supply (Water Quality) Regulations 1989, because of deficiencies in the distribution system. These failures do not make the water unsafe to drink at any time.

The former Companies of Three Valleys Water PLC gave legally binding undertakings in 1990 to carry out appropriate remedial
