## From Batu dar July 28. to Cuel day July 31. 1716.

An Abstract of the Act (passed in the last Session of Parliament) to oblige Papists to register their Names, and real Estares.

Nacted, That all Perfons not having taken the Ouths before the laft Day of Trinity Term 1716, having any Estate in Lands, &c. in England or Wales, &c. who is a Popth Recufant or Papilt, or educated in the Popish Religion, or whose Par rent is a Papist, shall if they be, on 24 June, 17.18. of the Age of st, by 20 Jan. 1776, and if they be, on the faid 24 June unbern, or under that Age, within the space of fix Months after they attain to that Age, and have an Enate, take the Oaths ap-pointed by an Act of this Selion, For the further Security of His Majefly's Perfon and Govern-ment, &c. and repeat and fubfcribe the Declaration 30 Car. 2. in the High Court of Chancery, King's Bench, Common Pleas, or Exchequer, or at the Gene-ral Quarter-Seffions where fuch Lands &c. do lye, between 9 and 12 in the Forenoon, or in default shall, within fix Months next atter the Time hereby appointed for them to take the Oaths, and to within fix Months after they, or any Truffec for them, fhall come into the Poffession of the Profits of any Lands, &c. register their Names and Lands; and fhall express in fuch Register in what Place fuch Lands lye, and who are the i offestors thereot, and of every Part thereof, and what Interest they have in the fame, and the yearly Rent referved, if the fame be Lett ; and if Lett upon Leafe, then by whom fuch Leafe was made, what yearly Rent is referred i thereon, and what Fine was paid for fuch Leife, if the fame was made by himfelt, or any in Truft for him, or that he was Party thereto, and the Time when fuch Butry made, in a Parchment Book or Roll to be kept by the Clerk of the Peace where fuch Lands lye.

Every Perfon whofe Name and Eftate ought to be registred, is to take care that his Name be, within the faid fix Months, fubferibed to fuch Registry m the prefence of two Justices of the Place, in open Seffions, either by himself, or by his lawful Attorney, authorized under his Hand and Seal, and executed in the prefence of two or more Witneffes, two of which Witneffes thall make Proof of fuch Execution on Oath at the Quarter-Seffions where fuch Name shall be subferibed, or Registry produced; and the Justices at the Quarter-Seffions are to examine the Witneffes on Oath for that Purpofe; and two Justices shall subferibe their Names to every Entry, as Wieneffes that the fame was duly made,

on forfeiture of 201 to the King. The Clerks of the Peace are to keep Parchment Books or Rolls at fome notorious Place in the County, &r. and fhall, by themfelves or Deputies, regifter the Chriftian and Siruames of all thofe who fhall come in Perfon and defire to be regiftred, or fhall fend any Writing under their Hands to fuch Clerk, defiring him to regifter their Names; and fhall regifter their Effates in fuch Kanner and Words as they fhall, by any Writing figned by them, defire fuch Clerk, &r. to regifter the fame: Provided they who defire fuch Regiftry do tender the Fees hereby appointed, and do apply to him to enter fuch Regiftry, and deliver in Writing the Words they defire to have regiftred, Ten Days at leaft before the Quarter-Seffions when the Entries are to be Subfcribed; and the Clerk, &c. fhall enter their Names and Regiftry of their Eftutes before the Quarter-Seffions, and carry the Books and Rolls to the next Quarter-Seffions, till the time of Subfcribing fhall be expired, that all thofe whofe Names fhall be regiftred, or their Attornies, mav come to the Quarter-Seffions, and fubfcribe their Names; and the Clerk fhall keep Alphabetical Tables of their Sirnames, and of the Place where the Lands lye, with Reference to the Books where fuch Names and Lands are registred; and shall carefully keep all Warrants of Attorney on a File, together with the Books or Rolls, and shall enter fuch Warrants on Record; and shall have for fuch Re~ gistry and Entry on Record Three Pence for every 200 Words, to be paid by the Perfon Registring, and Four Pence for every Search; and are to make Search on Request of any Perfon to infpect the Pables, Books, and Rolls, and fuch Letters of Attorney; and are to give Copies of fuch Registries, Subferibed by himfelf or Deputy, to those who defire fuch Copies, and tender him the Fees; and are to permit fuch Perfons to examine the fame with the Rolls or Books, and to take a Fee of Three Pence for every 200 Words in fuch Copy, and no more. Clerks returing to do any thing hereby required, and convicted thereof, shall forfeit their Office.

If any Person hereby required to take the Oaths, &cc. or in default to register his Name and Estate, shall not either take the Oaths, &cc. or register his Name and Eftate, and fubfcribe his Name, or procure it to be done by his Attorney within the Times limited, or fhall not register the fame truly, he fhall toricit the Fee-Simple and Inheritance of all such Lands, &c. not registred, or fraudulently registred, whereof he, or any in Truft for him, was feized at the Time of fuch Default or Fraud in Re-gistring, and the full Value of the Inheritance of all fuch Lands whereof he or any in Truft for him was not feized in Fee-Simple at the Time of or Dirich the Third to the third and the fuch Default, two Thirds to the King, and the other to a Pro estant who shall fue for the fame at the Courts in Weltminster, in such Action or other Procefs as shall be proper, accuding to the nature of the Cafe, and of the thing fued for, or in the Chan-cery; and the Perfon fuing in Chancery shall be entitled to demand all such Discoveries as he might do if he were a Purchafer on a valuable Confideration, and to demand a Difcovery of all Incumbrances and Titles any way affecting the fame, and of all Trufts relating thereto, or protecting the fame; to which no Demurrer shall be allowed, but the Defendant shall sufficiently answer the same at large; and he may bring an Ejectment upon his own De-mile, and give this Act, &cc. in Evidence; and if it shall appear on Tryal, that the Estate sued for is the Effate of the Perlon fo neglecting to register, or fraudulently Registring, and the Derendant can-not make it appear that he took the Oaths, &c. or that he registred his Name and the Estate fued for, a Verdict shall be given for the Leffor of the Plain-tiff in such Ejectment, and Judgment shall be had as upon Verdicts of Ejectment, and the Leffor shall have Costs of Suit; and by such Judgment Two third Parts of the Lands, &c. shall be vested in the King and she other in the Leffor of the Plain the King, and the other in the Leffor of the Plaintiff in the Ejectment.

Such Person being beyond Sea on 18 June, 1716 may take the Oaths, &c. by 20 May 1717. or in default may register within fix Months after, which shall be as good and effectual as it would have been if such Person had taken the Oaths, &c. betore 200 Jan. 1716.

In cafe fuch Perion fo making Default, or committing Fraud in Registring, shall, before Conviction, convey over such Lands, then the Perion so purchaling, &c. not knowing, at the time of Purchale, the Offender to be within the Deteription of this Act, shall not be prejudiced for such Forseiture; but the Offender shall, forseit the Value of the Lands. of the Rents for Six Months. Nor any Farmer or Tenant at Rack-Rent, who hold Leafes whereupon Two thirds of the full Yearly Value are referved.

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Nor extend to defeat or prejudice any Protestant or other Creditor, having any Charge or Incum-brance upon any real Estate directed to be Re-gaired, but the Detaulter shall forteit the Value of

the Charge or Incumbrance, One third to the Suer, the other Two to the King. No Perfon in the Eaft or West Indies, or America, Ihall be compelled to take the Oaths, &c. at the Time within montioned, but fhall have Twelve Months longer than the times allowed to Perfons bound the Seas beyond the Seas.

Venice, July 24. We have received Advice, that on the 8th Inftant there was an Engagement between the Fleet of this Republick and that of the Turks, in fight of the Ifland of Corfu. Our Fleet having got the Wind of the Enemy, bore down upon them and fought them with great Bravery, keep-ing the Wind of them from Four in the Af-ternoon till Night. The Sultana which had the Turkifh Admiral on board, was very much fhattered. On our Side, the Man of War com-manded by Sig. Cornaro, which was hard preffed by 6 Sultanas, was refcued by the Man of War com-manded by Sig. Flangini. The two Fleets being part-ted by the coming on of Night, prepared to te-new the Engagement the next Day, but the Weathe Fleet of this Republick and that of the Turks, new the Engagement the next Day, but the Wea-ther being calm prevented Action. Our Fleet had not at that Time been joyned by any of the Auxi-liaries; but the Maltefe Squadron being arrived at Cape St. Mary, was expected continually, as were also the other Auxiliarics; and we wait with Impatience to learn the Particulars of what has paffed. Some Advices by the Way of Otranto fay, the Turks having before the Engage-ment landed 10000 Men on the Ifland of Corfu, they were cut off from their Fleet, and had neither Cannon, Ammunition nor Provisions. They add, that 4 of the Turkish Sultanas were disabled in the Fight, and that feveral others were much shattered.

Pyrmont, August 3. His Majefty King George came hither on Saturday the 1st Inftant at Night, and this Morning began to drink the Waters.
