BARROW-IN-FURNESS BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County of Cumbria (Borough of Barrow-in-Furness) (Back Greengate Street) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) (No. 2) Order 1996.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness has, on 6th November 1996, made an Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which will come into force on 27th November 1996.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit vehicles from travelling along Back Greengate Street, Barrow-in-Furness, from its easterly junction with Fife Street for a distance of 2 metres in an easterly direction.

BARROW-IN-FURNESS BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County of Cumbria (Borough of Barrow-in-Furness) (Town Centre) (Various Roads) Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Barrow-in-Furness in pursuance of arrangements made with Cumbria County Council under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under the

provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police, propose to make the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order will be:

(1) To amend the entry relating to Parade Street in Schedule 7 (One-way Street) of The County of Cumbria (Borough of Barrow-in-Furness) (Central Traffic Control) (Central Area) Order 1992, Part I.

(2) One-way working will be introduced on the following sections of roads:

(a) *Parade Street*, from its junction with Clifford Street towards its junction with Duke Street.

(b) *Slater Street*, from its junction with Cavendish Street towards its junction with Buccleuch Street.

(3) Driving will be prohibited on St. Vincent Street, from its junction with Duke Street for a distance of 4 metres in a westerly direction.

(4) All vehicles proceeding along Slater Street (between Forshaw Street and Cavendish Street) will, at the junction of Slater Street with Cavendish Street, be permitted to make a left turn only, into Cavendish Street.

(5) All vehicles proceeding along Cavendish Street (westbound), on reaching Slater Street, will be permitted to proceed straight ahead only.
